Introducing the Brown Hare:

- o **Length**: 50-70cm
- o Weight: 2-5kg
- o Average lifespan: 2-4 years
- o Appearance: Golden brown with a pale belly, white tail, and long black-tipped ears.
- o They have longer legs than a common rabbit.
- o Speed: They can run up to 45 mph to escape predators!
- o **Habitat:** Found from January to December, commonly seen in open farmland, grasslands, and woodland edges. They favor arable fields, grasses, and hedgerows.
- o Diet: Graze on vegetation and the bark of young trees and bushes.
- Shelter: Don't dig burrows, instead rest in "forms" shallow depressions in the ground or grass.
- o **Movement:** When disturbed, they bound across fields using powerful hind legs, often in a zigzag pattern.
- o **Breeding:** Most visible in early spring during the breeding season. Females produce 3-4 litters of leverets (baby hares) per year.
- o **Boxing Behavior:** If you see boxing in the field, it's usually a female warding off a male. If two males fight, they stand on hind legs, using their front paws to pull fur from each other.

Make delicious chocolate cornflake cakes this Easter!

Here's a fun and delicious recipe for Chocolate Cornflake Buns with Mini Eggs—perfect for a treat to share or for any occasion:

What You Will Need:



- o 200g milk chocolate (or dark chocolate if preferred)
- o 100g butter
- 2 tbsp golden syrup (or honey as an alternative)
- o 120g cornflakes
- 100g mini eggs (plus extra for decorating)
- o Optional: A pinch of salt or vanilla extract for flavor





Now here's how to make them:

Prepare Your Tray: Line a muffin tray or bun tin with cupcake liners. This will make it easier to remove the buns once they've set.

Melt the Chocolate Mixture: In a saucepan, melt the butter, chocolate, and golden syrup over low heat. Stir occasionally until smooth. If you want a little extra flavor, add a pinch of salt or a drop of vanilla extract to the mix.

Mix the Cornflakes: Once the chocolate mixture is completely melted and smooth, remove from heat and let it cool slightly.

Gently fold the cornflakes into the melted chocolate mixture. Stir carefully so that the cornflakes are evenly coated without breaking them up too much.

Add the Mini Eggs: Crush a few mini eggs into smaller pieces (or leave them whole if you prefer more crunch).

Add the crushed mini eggs to the cornflake mixture and mix gently to combine. If you prefer whole mini eggs, you can add them on top later for decoration.

Scoop into Cases: Spoon the cornflake mixture into the cupcake liners, filling them to the top.

Decorate: Place a mini egg or two on top of each bun for decoration.

Chill and Set: Refrigerate the buns for at least 1-2 hours, or until the chocolate has fully set and they're firm to the touch.

Serve: Once set, they're ready to enjoy! Store them in the fridge for up to 1 week or in an airtight container.

Tips: You can customize this recipe by adding other treats like marshmallows or dried fruits to the cornflake mixture.

For a twist, use white chocolate instead of milk chocolate for a different flavor profile.

Enjoy your yummy chocolate cornflake buns with a crunchy twist and colorful mini eggs!

Mini Eggs can be a CHOKING HAZARD, not suitable for children under 4!
